Measure E Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee - STRUCTURE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Bond Election

On November 2, 2004, voters residing within the Yosemite Community College District (YCCD) passed Measure E – Local Community College Repair/Overcrowding Measure with a 60.84% yes vote.

Establishment of a Citizens' Oversight Committee

When the bonds passed, Proposition 39 (state law) required that the YCCD Board of Trustees appoint a Citizens' Oversight Committee to work with the community college district.

Committee Membership

The committee will consist of at least seven (7) members and must include:

- One (1) Business Representative Active in a business organization representing local commerce:
- One (1) Senior Citizen Group Representative Active member in a senior citizens' organization.
- One (1) **Taxpayer Organization Member** Active in a bona fide taxpayers' association.
- One (1) MJC/Columbia College Student Enrolled and active in a community college support group.
- One (1) Member of College Support Organization Active in an organization, such as the Foundation.
- Two (2) At Large Community Member Resident of the Yosemite Community College District.

To be a qualified person, he or she must be at least 18 years of age. No member may be an employee or official of the district or a vendor, contractor or consultant of the District.

Committee Responsibilities

In accordance with Education Code Section 15278(b), "the purpose of the Citizens' Oversight Committee shall be to inform the public concerning the expenditure of bond revenues."

Specifically, the Committee shall:

- actively review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction;
- ensure that bond revenues are expended pursuant to constitutional requirements;
- · receive annual performance and financial audits;
- make annual reports to the community.

Appointment of Committee Members

All appointments will be made by the Board of Trustees, chosen from applications submitted to the District.

Time Commitment and Term

Members shall serve a two-year term. Initial appointments were staggered, such that one-half of the initial appointees were allowed to serve one full two-year term. The other initial appointments only served one-year, but are eligible for reappointment by the Board for a second and third consecutive two-year term.

Meetings

The committee is expected to meet quarterly (March, June, September, and December) together with a designated member of the Board of Trustees, District Chancellor, College President, Executive Vice-Chancellor of Fiscal Services, Director of Facilities and Planning and District Director of Public Affairs. The committee meets as a committee of the whole.

State law and committee bylaws require that committee members not have a potential conflict of interest. Specifically, a committee member may not be a district employee, vendor, contractor or consultant. Employment which could result in becoming a contractor or subcontractor to the district would also be a potential conflict.

Measure E Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee - ETHICS POLICY STATEMENT

This Ethics Policy Statement provides general guidelines for Committee members to follow in carrying out their roles. Not all ethical issues that Committee members face are covered in this Statement. However, this Statement captures some of the critical areas that help define ethical and professional conduct for Committee members. The provisions of this Statement were developed from existing laws, rules, policies and procedures as well as from concepts that define generally accepted good business practices. Committee members are expected to strictly adhere to the provisions of this Ethics Policy.

Policy

CONFLICT OF INTEREST.

A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds or (2) any construction project which will benefit the committee member's outside employment, business, or a personal finance or benefit an immediate family member, such as a spouse, child or parent.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT.

A Committee member shall not use his or her authority over a particular matter to negotiate future employment with any person or organization that relates to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds, or (2) any construction project. A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to any construction project involving the interest of a person with whom the member has an agreement concerning current or future employment, or remuneration of any kind. For a period of two (2) years after leaving the Committee, a former Committee member may not represent any person or organization for compensation in connection with any matter pending before the District that, as a Committee member, he or she participated in personally and substantially. Specifically, for a period of two (2) years after leaving the Committee, a former Committee member and the companies and businesses for which the member works shall be prohibited from contracting with the District with respect to: (1) bidding on projects funded by the bond proceeds; and (2) any construction project.

COMMITMENT TO UPHOLD LAW.

A Committee member shall uphold the federal and California Constitutions, the laws and regulations of the United States and the State of California (particularly the Education Code) and all other applicable government entities, and the policies, procedures, rules and regulations of the Yosemite Community College District.

COMMITMENT TO DISTRICT.

A Committee member shall place the interests of the District above any personal or business interest of the member.
