The Yosemite Community College District (YCCD), in cooperation with the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), will conduct an environmental investigation at the Modesto Junior College, West Campus (MJC-WC). The MJC-WC is located at 2201 Blue Gum Avenue in Modesto, California, on a former military installation known as Hammond General Hospital.

The YCCD plans to collect soil, soil vapor, and groundwater samples at various locations on the MJC-WC. Investigation work will begin on or about August 4, 2008, and may continue into October 2008. Field crews will use a variety of sampling devices, including water well drilling rigs, backhoes, and hand-operated sampling equipment. No contamination has been confirmed. However, the field crews may wear protective suits and equipment as a precaution.
