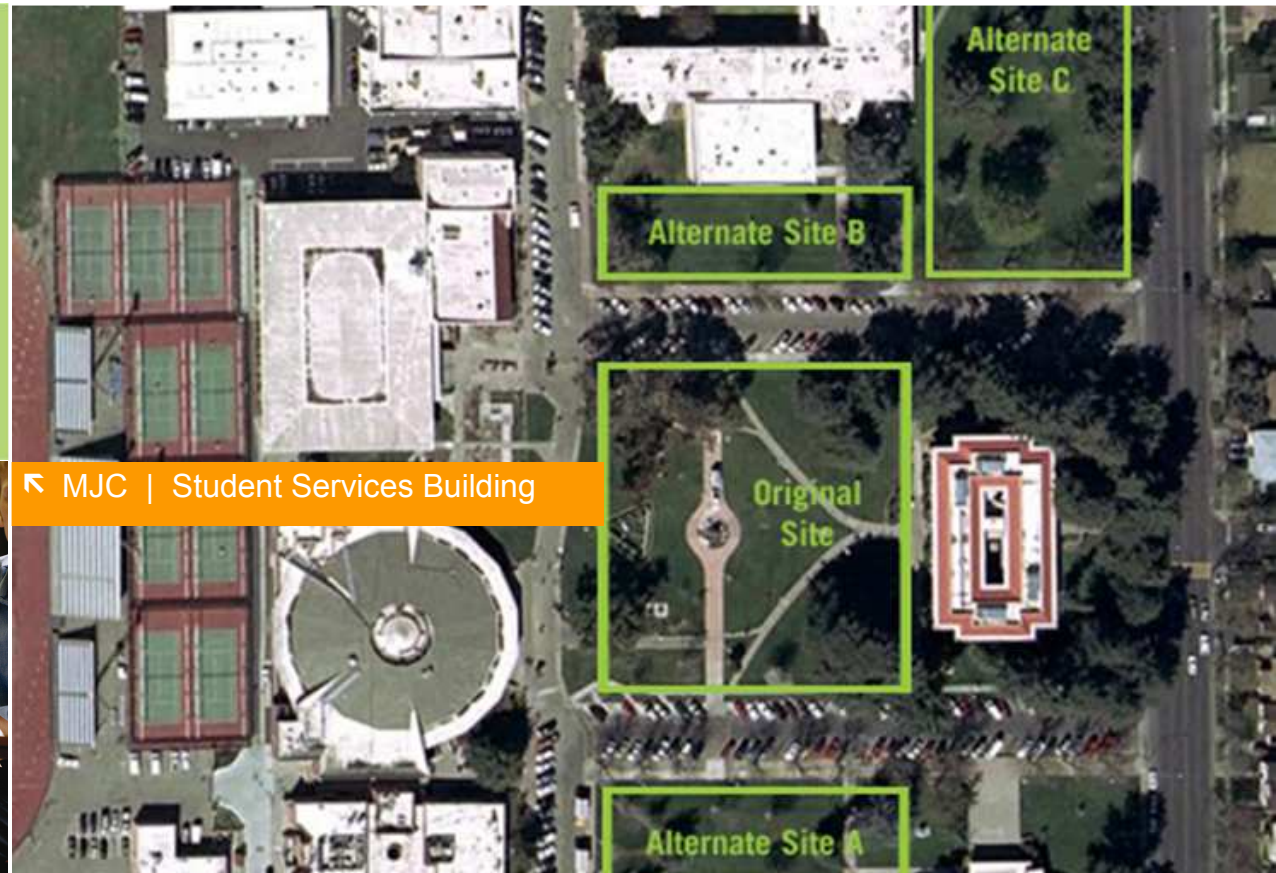

## INTRODUCTION AND PROJECT TEAMS

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### **Introduction**

This document outlines the project program and design priorities for the new Student Services Project for the Modesto Junior College East Campus. The Campus is one of two that comprise Modesto Junior College. The College began in 1921 is situated in the Central Valley, serving an agricultural and manufacturing based economy. It is one of two comprehensive colleges within the Yosemite Community College District, which covers a 4,500 square mile area encompassing all of two counties (Stanislaus and Tuolumne) and parts of four others (Calaveras, Merced, San Joaquin and Santa Clara).

The new Student Services Project will consolidate the existing Student Services programs spread throughout East Campus, incorporate a Testing Center currently housed on West Campus, and allow for some growth in these programs. The project site is located at the heart of the campus, adjacent to the existing Morris Memorial Building in the landscaped campus quad near the main pedestrian circulation route. The District and the Campus want the new Student Services Project to be the missing front door to the East Campus, and to include a One Stop Shop approach to student services. The building should be contemporary and clearly identifiable as a landmark building, but also be harmonious with the existing campus fabric.

### Three-story Scheme

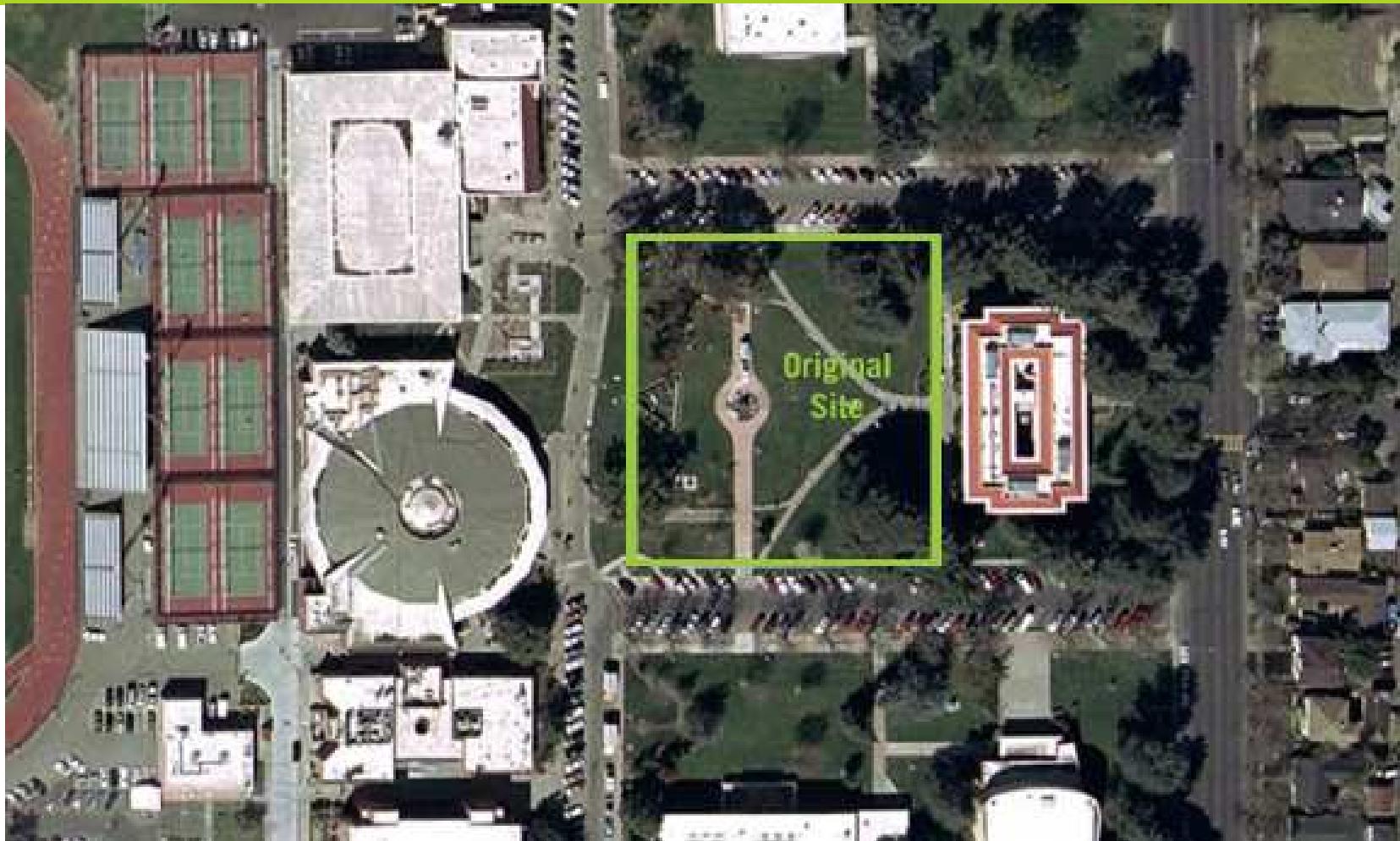

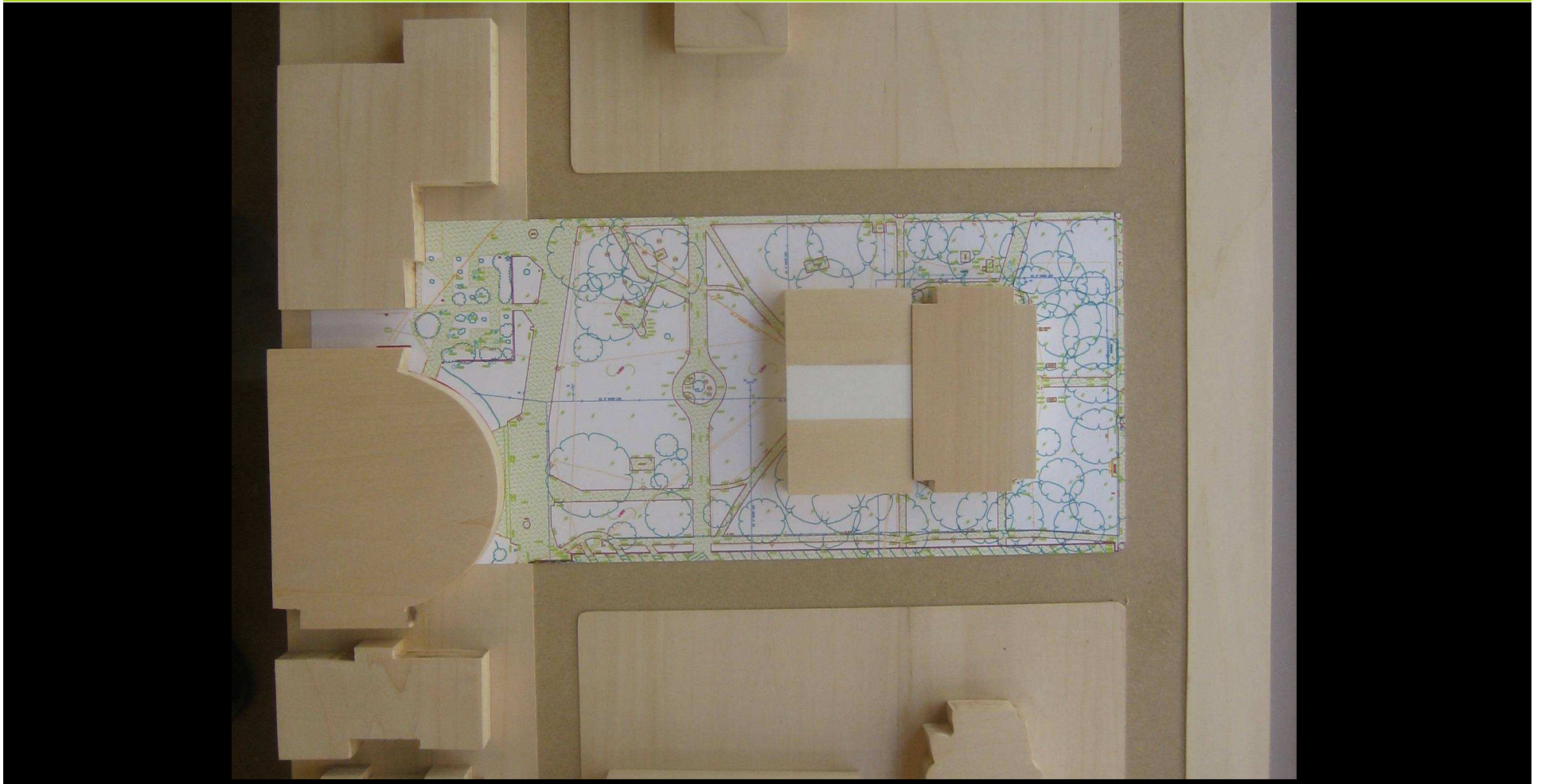

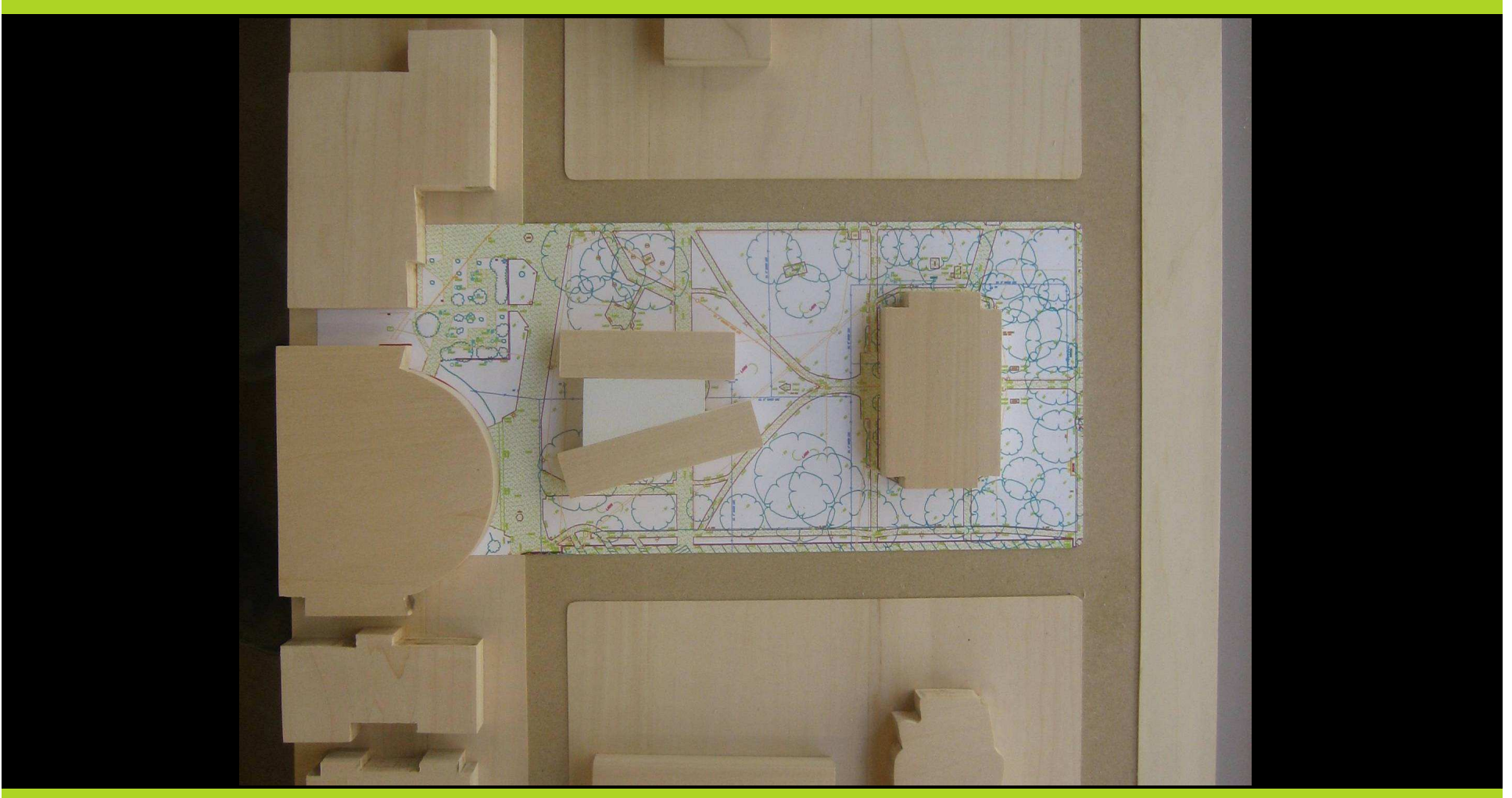

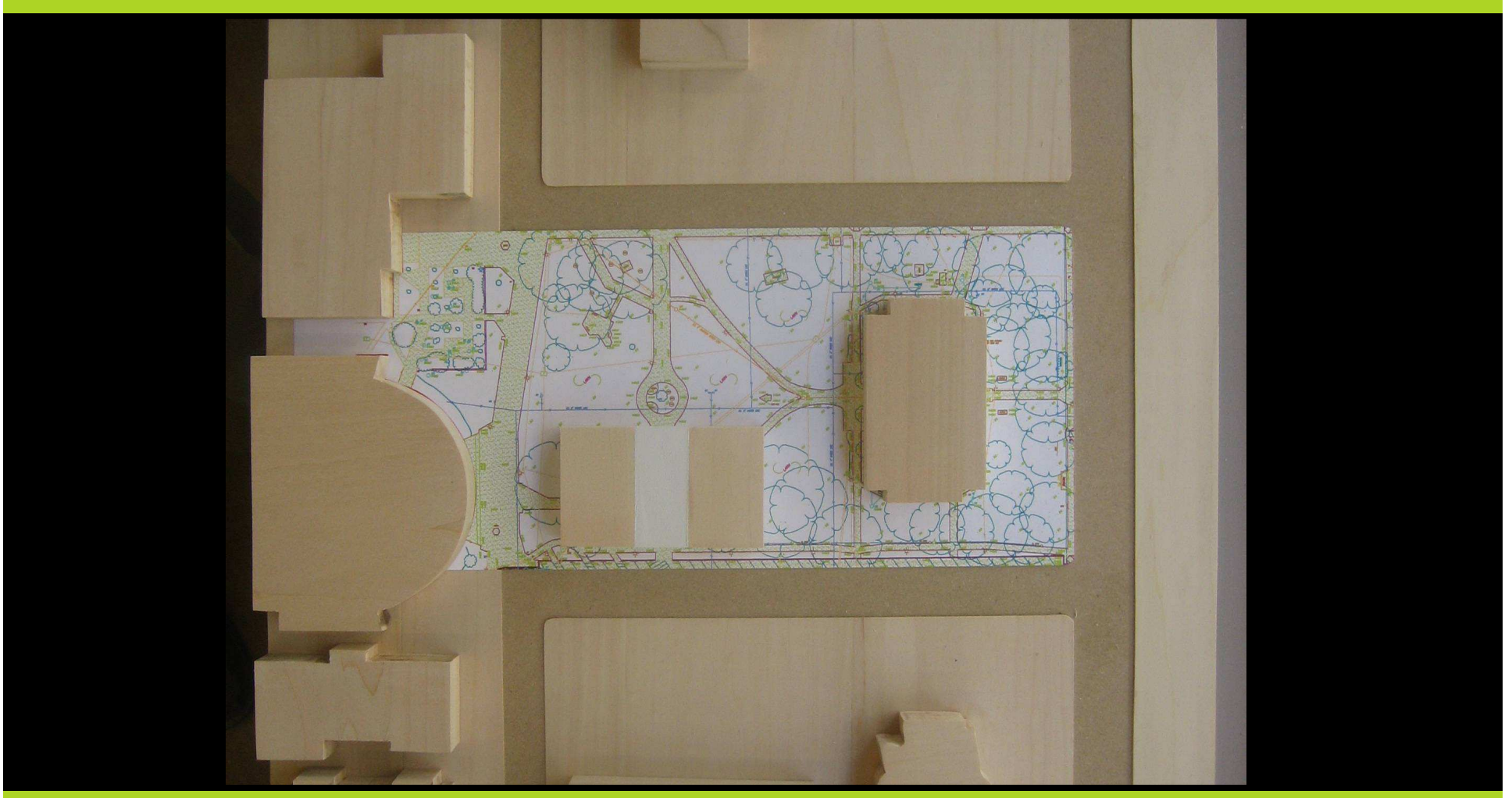

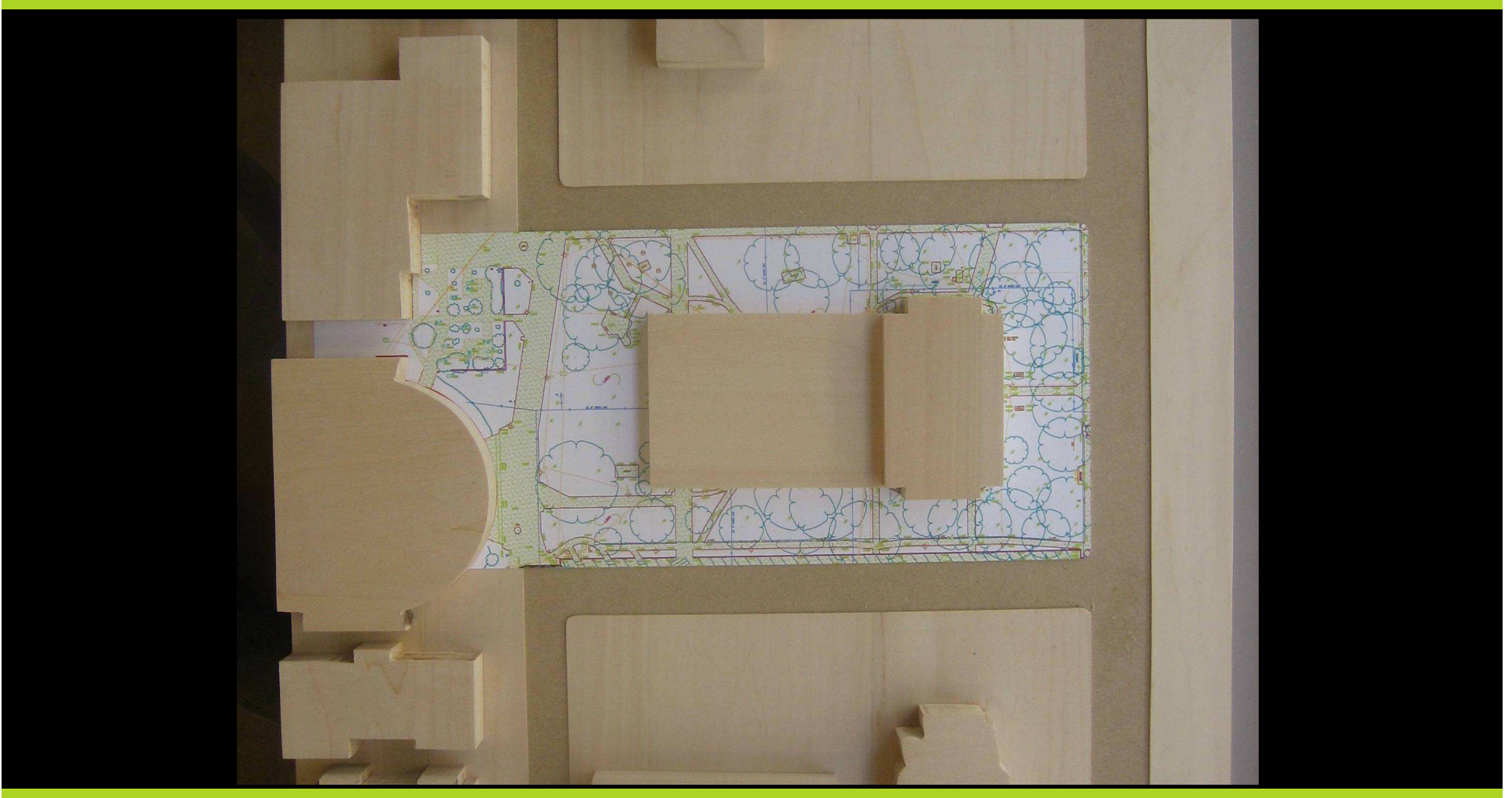

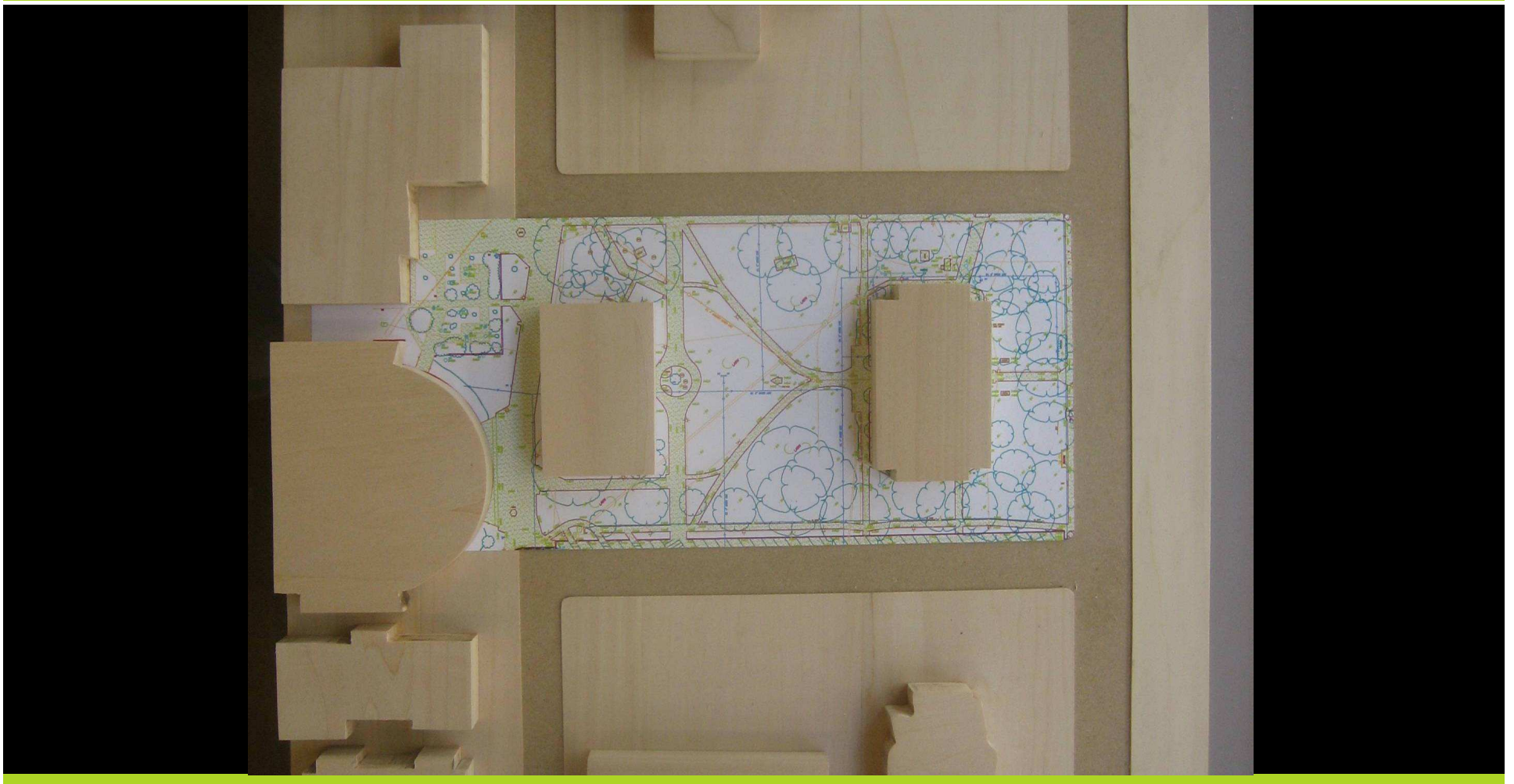

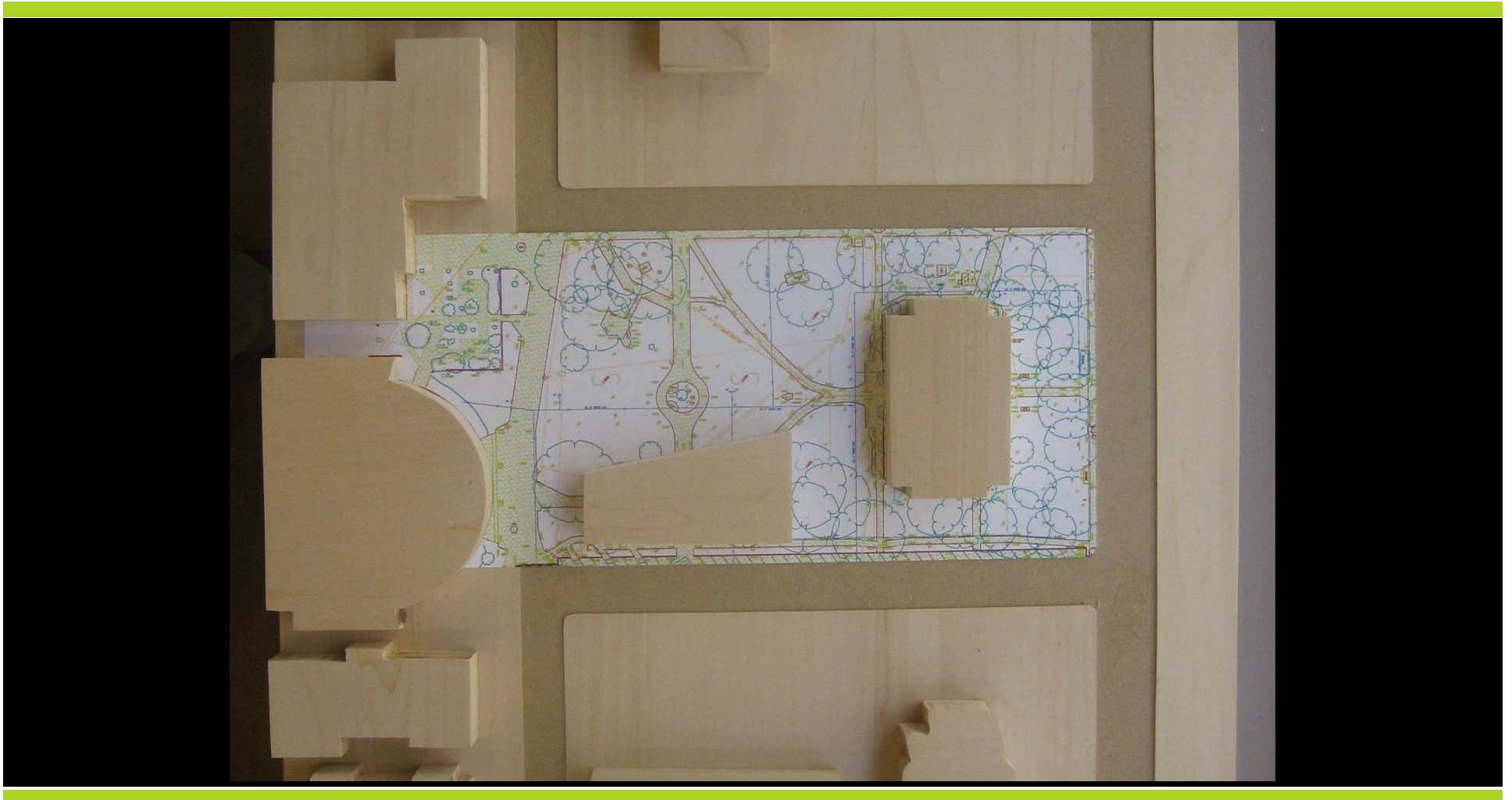

### Summary

The purpose of this public forum was to discuss locations for the Student Services Building on East Campus, with the goal of a recommendation for the President to take to the Chancellor.

### Details

#### 1. Introduction:

- Dr. Rose and Dr. Nadell prefaced the session by reiterating goal noted above, emphasizing focus on East Campus. Matt Kennedy noted that project delay costs for escalation estimated at roughly \$43,000/month. Bob Lavey presented a brief history of project design process.

#### 2. Project Priorities identified for MJC and East Campus.

- One Stop Shop = Proximity of program pieces
- Less cars on the campus proper ?
- Maintain green space
- Pedestrian connection of services
- Serve our students BEST: Centralized services
- Cost – meeting budget to maximize building size
- Culture and college atmosphere
- “Face” of College
- Clear campus maneuverability and wayfinding
- Welcoming presence
- Long term trends for College – population
- Save the Quad
- Preserve and stimulate “culture”
- Combat ignorance / help educate

### 3. Potential New Building sites on East Campus defined.

    - Close to parking lots
  - Disadvantages:
    - Inconsistent with FMP
    - Potential substructure
    - \$500,000 redesign costs
    - \$466,000 parking/road change
    - Blocks and eliminates parking
    - Removes accessible parking
    - Increased City and Agency involvement



- Alternate Site C: Northeast of the Quad
  - Advantages:
    - Flexible building placement
    - Closest to Morris, if located on south part of site
    - Closest to parking lot (north)
    - Welcoming corner / gateway
    - Potential symmetry with Auditorium
    - No previous buildings onsite
    - Front door presence
  - Disadvantages:
    - Remote from other Student Services and much of campus
    - Budget means only portion of site could be developed
    - Traffic on north drive interferes with connection to Morris
    - Unique trees used for education
    - Potential to interfere with trees on College Ave
    - Remote – not centralized
    - Only site on campus with trees and without building: preserve beauty
- Other Possible Sites:
  - Tennis Courts
    - Advantage: No vocal opponents
    - Disadvantage: Time/\$ (other project(s) must be created and completed first)
  - Existing Buildings, either Student Center or Morris/Science combination
    - Advantage: Keeps campus land free
    - Disadvantage: Time/\$ (other project(s) must be created and completed first)
- One attendee noted that all Sites have the following program problems:
  - Building size too small
  - Not a true One Stop Shop
  - Center of campus, not gateway
  - Degrade campus
  - Measure E violation?

#### 5. Participants hand-voted on site recommendation for a priority listing of preferred sites:

- First Vote : Each participant given 2 votes, one each for top 2 site choices
  - Original Site = 19 (#2)
  - Alternate Site A = 6 (#3)
  - Alternate Site A1 = 2
  - Alternate Site B = 2
  - Alternate Site B1 = 4 (#4)
  - Alternate Site C = 34 (#1)
  - Other Site Tennis Courts = 0
  - Other Site Existing Buildings = 1
- Second Vote : Runoff of Top 3 Site preferences, each participant given 1 vote
  - Original Site = 15
  - Alternate Site A = 1
