He also oversaw upgrading the University's core network infrastructure, facilitated an expansion of public cloud migration, increased virtual labs by 300%, and collaborated with the Research Foundation to secure a National Science Foundation grant to replace the outdated High Performance Computing cyberinfrastructure for the College of Science and College of Engineering.

He is dedicated to fostering a culture of innovation that empowers students, faculty, and staff to reach their full potential. At YCCD, his focus is on creating a better digital experience for students by strengthening cybersecurity, enhancing infrastructure, and supporting student-driven decision-making.
