COMMENTS

From the Public

Charlie Menghetti, General Contractor, Menghetti Construction, brought comments to the Board on the bid process. He has been a local resident most of his life and has completed many public agency projects. Mr. Menghetti, along with other local contractors, have looked forward to and long anticipated the opening of the bidding process on projects like Allied Health, Science, the Ag Pavilion, and others. He states he is perplexed by the prequalification process. He was determined not qualified even though he is within the scope of the bonding capacity and has the level of expertise. Mr. Menghetti believes that the District's prequalification process is ineffective and unfavorable towards local contractors. His company has done projects for other community colleges, including Merced, Delta, Monterey, Hartnell, and Ohlone; yet, Menghetti Construction was unable to meet the stringent prequalification process here. Mr. Menghetti stated that if it is the Board's desire to provide opportunities to local contractors, then the prequalification process should be reviewed and modified. There are at least three local vendors that meet the bond capacity for many projects. He requested that the process be reviewed and the standards be made fair and equitable for local vendors to competitively bid on Measure E projects. Chair DeMartini requested that the Chancellor place the construction bidding process on the next agenda for review and discussion.

Student Activity Report

ASMJC President Levi Ogden reported the fireworks sales were \$6,000. ASMJC will have 10 students in attendance at the Summer Sonata. ASMJC has completed its budget for this year, appointed officers, and are delegating duties. There is a dedicated team that is ready to go and looking forward to the Fall.

Student Trustee Elizabeth McMahon, on behalf of ASCC, invited everyone to the Student Housing Open House on July 27 and August 26 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. No other ASCC activities are planned for the summer.

Academic Senate Reports

Columbia College Academic Senate President Erik Andal reported that a Faculty Retreat is scheduled for August 21-22 at Baker Station, with a work day on August 21 and discussion and presentations on August 22. Mad About Science is occurring on the campus for approximately 73 children, third through eighth graders. The Science Technology Assistance for Rural Teachers and Small Districts (STARTS) program provided training for 42 kindergarten, first, and second grade teachers. The Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee toured Bond Projects on Columbia's campus last week.

Comments were very positive. Groundbreaking for the Science & Natural Resources Building will be held on August 13 at 10 a.m. and the Ribbon Cutting for the Mahogany Building will follow at 10:30 a.m. Mr. Andal expressed thanks to Judy Lanchester, Ron Martin, Sonora Airco Gas & Gear, and Sierra Conservation Center. He acknowledged various instructors, advisory committee members, and community members for their assistance and participation in this project. His department is working to certify the programs for auto body and welding.

MJC Academic Senate President Mike Adams is the new Senate President. He reported spending cutbacks for MJC Institute Day; faculty are participating in planning. The State Curriculum Institute will occur July 9-11. No major State rule changes are anticipated. The Fall Semester schedule is set. Cuts have been made to the Fall schedule and additional cuts are anticipated for Spring. Faculty and Deans are actively working together to identify courses to cut while maintaining courses that are academically necessary. The Planning and Budget Committee have met once and are in need of the State budget to move forward with planning. Mr. Adams expressed his thanks to Central Services, classified staff, administration and so many others during this budget crisis. By comparison to other community colleges, we are doing fairly well, even in this tough economic time.

President Rose called the Board's attention to the recent award by the Ag Department: Outstanding Ag Program in the State. Dean Mark Anglin presented Ag members: Don Borges, Marlies Boyd, and John Mendes. Steve Amador was recognized at the State Conference as one of ten Teachers of Excellence throughout the State. Mr. Anglin recognized all Ag faculty and classified staff for their work as a dedicated team. Trustee Dean thanked Mr. Anglin for sharing these accomplishments. Trustee Abshire expressed appreciation to the Ag department and to Mr. Anglin for his leadership which is well known in the community. Trustee Riley stated that the MJC graduates of the Ag program have a strong reputation throughout the state and thanked Mr. Anglin for the great work.

MJC Nursing Faculty Publish Article and HPSL Coordinator Position Funded

MJC nursing faculty members Kelly Butler and Dawn Veltre, along with a nursing colleague from CSU, Sacramento, have recently published an article in the Clinical Simulation in Nursing online journal entitled, "Implementation of Active Learning Pedagogy Comparing Low-Fidelity Simulation Versus High Fidelity Simulation in Pediatric Nursing Education." This article adds validity to the importance of clinical simulation in nursing education and demonstrates that MJC is on the cutting edge of human patient simulation lab (HPSL) technology. In another exciting development, the hospital consortium has stepped forward to fund the full-time faculty position to coordinate MJC's HPSL simulation lab and run simulations in all four semesters of the nursing program.

MJC Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

A Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the new Modesto Junior College parking lot on Tully Road will be held on Tuesday, July 21, at 10:00 a.m. The campus and community are invited to join us for a brief ceremony celebrating the completion of this Measure E project featuring 455 parking spaces, representing a net gain of 250 spaces for students on MJC's East Campus.

Awards of Excellence

The 2007-08 Annual Report for Modesto Junior College and Vistas and Voices staff newsletter each won an "Award of Excellence" in the Central Valley Public Relations Organization competition. President Smith reported that she, in collaboration with local business Front Porch, and with the help of other Sonora community members, wrote a grant to fund Mad About Science at Columbia College. Next year Columbia will host a Mad About Math event.

Measure E Building Ceremonies

The Science and Natural Resources Building groundbreaking ceremony will be August 13, 2009, at 10:00 a.m. The building will consist of 21,000 sq. ft. of interior space on two floors, and a total of 33,661 sq. ft. when including all exterior covered areas and will become one of the largest buildings on campus. Anticipated completion date is Spring 2011. The facility will house the biology, chemistry, physics, anatomy, earth sciences, geology, forestry and GIS classrooms, labs, offices and study rooms. Its multiple energy conservation features will qualify the building for a LEED Silver Certification.

The Mahogany Building ribbon cutting will be August 13, 2009, at 10:30 a.m. This building is located adjacent to the Madrone Building (automotive technology) and will house an auto body collision repair and a welding technology lab. Included in the 7,562 sq. ft. building will be an auto body painting booth, state-of-the-art welding and exhaust stations, office area, storage, and restrooms. The Mahogany Building will free up much needed floor space in the Madrone Building and will provide more efficiency for student instruction.

Summer Culinary Arts Institute

Columbia College's Summer Culinary Arts Institute is currently being conducted through August 6. Training in commercial food preparation is provided during the nine-week program. Students learn how to estimate food costs per meal, menu planning, baking skills, customer service, and teamwork. In addition, students plan, prepare and serve specially themed buffets for the public every Thursday from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. in the Cellar Restaurant.

Chancellor Roe Darnell extended congratulations to another MJC Ag success and asked that Mr. Anglin convey his congratulations to the Ag Department.

Chancellor's Update

The Chancellor reported that the State budget continues to shift and change. The State's anticipated \$8 billion federal bailout is tied to the level of funding for higher education. There is talk of suspending Prop 98. The June payment for property taxes statewide is \$1 billion short. The Chancellor cautioned that the Legislature may be scrutinizing college curriculum next year. Dr. Darnell cautioned that the 2010-2011 will be more difficult than this year as a \$12 million shortfall is anticipated. Our colleges and administration continue to address this budget issue.

Student Travel

Columbia College Shakespeare Live – Ashland, Oregon Columbia College is seeking Board approval for ten students and community members to travel to Ashland, Oregon, the home of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival from September 30 through October 4, 2009. Instructor Jim Toner will lead the experience which includes five plays, acting workshops, prologues and conversations with actors. The trip is offered as an English 125 course. The travel and accommodations are \$400 per person, paid in advance by each attendee. The instructor receives no additional compensation for this trip and is responsible for his lodging and food expenses.

Chair DeMartini opened discussion on this topic and expressed concern with students missing other classes that are scheduled at the same time and inquired regarding purpose of scheduling at this specific time frame, with Trustee Riley expressing similar concerns. Trustee Rojas stated that these types of conflicts also occur in athletic programs and that students and teachers work it out. President Smith commented that this program is to benefit students, and the goal is to not limit student opportunities and further stated that the instructor is offering this opportunity above and beyond his normal instruction. Students have the choice of whether or not to enroll in this course and determine if it works with their class schedule. Vice President Gervin stated that this is the first time this is being offered during the semester and that was in response to student interest. Trustee Flores

stated she is confident that instructors offer quality instructional opportunities to students. Student Trustee McMahon stated that students expect these conflicts and recommended that the Board approve the travel, further stating that student and instructors often work these matters out among themselves.

Trustee Rojas called for the question, seconded by Trustee Hallinan, to conclude discussion and take the matter to vote. That motion passed with a 7-0 vote.

A motion was made by Trustee Rojas, seconded by Trustee Dean that the Board approve ten students and community members to travel to Ashland, Oregon, the home of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival from September 30-October 4, 2009.

The motion carried with a vote of 5-2, Chair DeMartini and Trustee Riley voting against.
