1. MJC Music Department Fall Concerts

The MJC Music Department is holding High School Orchestra Day on November 12, 9:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m., in the Auditorium with free admission, followed by four weeks of Fall concerts. Fall Electronic Music Concert, Wednesday, November 18 at 7:30 in the Music Recital Hall is also free. The "Just Jazz" program on Monday, November 23 at 7:30 p.m. in the Auditorium will feature MJC's Jazz Ensemble directed by Professor Erik Maki. He will also direct the MJC Symphonic Band Concert as they present "Contemporary Classics" on Monday, December 7 at 7:30 p.m. in the Auditorium, which is free with donations accepted. The MJC Community Orchestra Concert, under the baton of Professor Anne Martin, will present "From Mozart to the Movies!" on Tuesday, December 8 at 7:30 p.m. in the Auditorium. Admission is \$3 general and \$1 for students and seniors. On Wednesday, December 9, Professor Maki will conduct the MJC Community Concert Band as they present "American and European Band Masters" at 7:30 p.m. in the Auditorium, and admission is free with donations accepted.

2. MAPS Presentations

Modesto Area Partners in Science will explore the topic "Tornadoes in the San Joaquin Valley" on Friday, November 20, at 7:30 p.m. in Forum 110. Mike Whittier, MJC Professor of Earth Science, will explain how winds and terrain can create tornadoes in the San Joaquin Valley. He will identify areas in our region where tornado concentrations are highest and explore the topographic controls that influence these patterns. On Friday, December 4, MAPS will present "Nutrition and Your Carbon Footprint" at 7:30 p.m., in Forum 110. Dr. Gail Feenstra is the food systems coordinator at the UC Sustainable Agriculture Research and Education Program. Her presentation will describe the food system's impact on global warming and the "hot spots" which have emerged.

3. Veteran's Day Appreciation

Columbia College hosted a Veteran's Day appreciation for the college's veteran students and their families on November 10, 2009, in the Student Center. Local representatives from the Veteran's of Foreign Wars (VFW) organization and the Veteran's Affairs Clinic were speakers and provided valuable information to the students.

4. ASCC Partners With the Community

The ASCC (Associated Students of Columbia College) are currently promoting a canned food drive in partnership with Tuolumne County's Amador-Tuolumne Community Action Agency (A-TCAA) Food Bank. The Columbia College Library is offering late fee forgiveness in exchange for bringing in food items. The ASCC also hosted a Blood Drive on November 2, 2009, in partnership with Delta Blood Bank.

5. "Chicken Soup and Flu Kits"

On October 27 and 28, Health Services worked with the Academic Wellness Educators group and the Hospitality Management Program to offer "Chicken Soup and Flu Kits." Free chicken soup and flu kits (hand sanitizer, herbal tea, tissues, thermometers, cough drops, fever reducing medications, and four pages of flu related information) were given to the first 100 students who participated each day.

A Columbia College team attended the Research Professionals Group *Strengthening Student Success Conference* in San Francisco. As one of last year's Hewlett Leaders in Student Success award winners, Columbia College was invited to present at the conference. Anne Cavagnaro, Patricia Harrelson, and Adrienne Seegers led a workshop titled, *Academic Wellness Educators—More than Just Basic Skills*. The team highlighted Columbia College's unique and collaborative approach to the basic skills initiative. Faculty members shared activities including: Embedding Tutors, House Calls (math teachers visiting vocational classes to present a home grown problem solving module), and Embedding Basic Skills in Programs and Courses class.

E. Consent Agenda, Student Travel

1. American College Dance Festival – Tempe, Arizona

The MJC Dance program has been invited to attend the American College Dance Festival Southwest Region conference at the Arizona State University, March 17 – 21, 2009. The Festivals provide a venue to engage in four days of performances, workshops, panels, and master classes. Faculty members Lori Bryhni and Kim Davis and administrator Michael Sundquist (and ten students) seek Board approval to attend this event. The approximate cost of the trip is \$9,500 which includes festival registration, airfare, transportation, and hotel costs. All expenses will be paid using funds from the Fund 12 dance account and the Friends of Dance account.

2. <u>Arizona National Collegiate Livestock Judging Contest - Phoenix, Arizona</u>

MJC is seeking Board approval to travel to the Livestock Judging Team competition in Phoenix, Arizona. The MJC Livestock Judging Team has been invited to compete in the Arizona National Collegiate Livestock Judging Contest. Mr. John Mendes and Ms. Amanda Schnoor, MJC Livestock Judging Team coaches, are planning a trip for the team from December 28, 2009 to January 1, 2010. The approximate cost of the trip for the coaches and eight team members will be \$2,500.00. The funds for the trip will be paid through CTE, Departmental Travel and/or Livestock Club funds.

3. Northern Exposure Livestock Judging Contest - Stillwater, Oklahoma

The MJC Livestock Judging Team has been invited to compete in the Northern Exposure Livestock Judging Contest in Stillwater, Oklahoma. Mr. John Mendes and Ms. Amanda Schnoor, MJC Livestock Judging Team coaches, are planning a trip for the coaches and eight team members that will span from December 17-20, 2009. The approximate cost of the trip will be \$4,500. The funds for the trip will be paid through CTE, Departmental Travel, Agriculture Departmental Fundraising, and/or Livestock Club funds.

F. Consent Agenda, Curriculum Action

The Stanislaus County Area Joint Manufacturing and Maintenance Apprentice Program include the following apprenticeships: Electrical Maintenance, Instrument Technician, Machinist, Maintenance Mechanic, and Packaging Technician.

The apprenticeship program was approved in March 2009 by the MJC Curriculum Committee and should have been submitted to the Board in Summer 2009 with other curriculum items for approval. Board approval is needed to complete the State application process.

G. Discussion Items

1. CSEA, Chapter 420, Negotiated Contract Language

Representatives of CSEA, Chapter 420, and the Yosemite Community College District have reached agreement regarding new contract language through the negotiations process. The new CSEA Contract period is for three years beginning July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2012. The contract was previously provided to the Board for review.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve the negotiated 3 year CSEA Contract (July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2012), between CSEA, Chapter 420 and YCCD which was ratified by the bargaining unit members on October 5, 2009.

Discussions between YCCD and CSEA, Chapter 420 regarding 2009-2010 contract negotiations are continuing. Based on this process, both parties (YCCD/CSEA) have developed and reached agreement on a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

The MOU provides for both parties to begin negotiations regarding medical benefits (Article 12 of the CSEA Contract) within 20 calendar days of the ratified date of the attached MOU.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve the attached MOU between YCCD and CSEA, Chapter 420, subject to successful completion of CSEA's ratification process scheduled for November 6, 2009.

The current YCCD/YFA negotiated agreement provides that either party may reopen negotiations for the 2009-10 year. YFA has presented its proposal to the District. The next step in the process is the scheduling of a public hearing.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Trustees:

- a. Accept the attached YFA negotiations proposal reopener to YCCD;
- b. Schedule a public hearing on the proposal for December 9, 2009; and
- c. Refer the proposal to administrative staff for review.

G. Discussion Items

The current YCCD/YFA negotiated agreement provides that either party may reopen negotiations for the 2009-10 year. The District has presented its proposal to YFA. YCCD's negotiations reopener for YFA negotiations is for discussion of benefits only. The next step in the process is the scheduling of a public hearing.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Trustees:

- a. Receive the attached YCCD negotiations proposal reopener to YFA.
- b. Schedule a public hearing on the proposal for December 9, 2009.
- c. Refer the proposal to administrative staff for review.

5. ★Quarterly Report on the District's Financial Condition

Consistent with prevailing fiscal practices and in compliance with current statute, staff prepared the quarterly statement of the District's financial condition for the quarter ended September 30, 2009, a copy is attached. The Board is required by law to hold a public hearing to review the report and direct staff to file with the Stanislaus County Superintendent of Schools and the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office. Staff will be at Board meeting to present the report and respond to questions.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Trustees:

- a. Conduct a public hearing to review the District's financial report for the quarter ended September 30, 2009; and
- b. Direct Staff to submit a copy of the required report to the Stanislaus County Superintendent of Schools and the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office.

6. ★CalSTRS Pension2 457 Deferred Compensation Plan

The California State Teachers Retirement System (CalSTRS) has established a Pension2 457 Deferred Compensation Plan pursuant to Section 457 of the Internal Revenue Code. If adopted, this plan will permit qualified Yosemite Community College District certificated employees to avail themselves of the investment options provided by the plan. **Resolution No. 09-10/04** will allow CalSTRS to make this plan available to certificated employees who wish to enroll in the program.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees adopt **Resolution No. 09-10/04** and direct staff to execute the adoption agreement and any required documents to provide CalSTRS with information as needed in the administration of the plan.

G. <u>Discussion Items</u>

7. Renaming of the MJC Aquatic Facility

Dave Ashleigh has been identified as a distinguished faculty member, a most distinguished coach and perhaps one of the greatest water polo players in the history of the game. Dave is a man who has dedicated his life to his family, his athletes, his country in the 1964 and 1968 Olympic Games and Modesto Junior College. Dave has been inducted into the UCLA Hall of Fame, the USA Water Polo Hall of Fame, the Water Polo Coaches Hall of Fame, Modesto Junior College Athletic Hall of Fame and, most recently, our local SOS Club Hall of Fame. Dave Ashleigh is most deserving in every single category.

The Physical, Recreation and Health Education (PRHE) Division, MJC Campus Development Committee, Facilities/Capital Construction Advisory Committee, College Council, and President's Cabinet have recommended to the MJC President the renaming of the MJC Aquatic facility to the "Dave Ashleigh Aquatic Center."

An endowment by his alumni, established through the MJC Foundation Office, will fund the cost of signage, support of the dedication ceremony and on-going support of aquatic programs at Modesto Junior College.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Trustees approve the following new name for the MJC Aquatic Facility: **Dave Ashleigh Aquatic Center.**

8. <u>☆ Prequalification Analysis and Resolution</u>
